Border Crossings

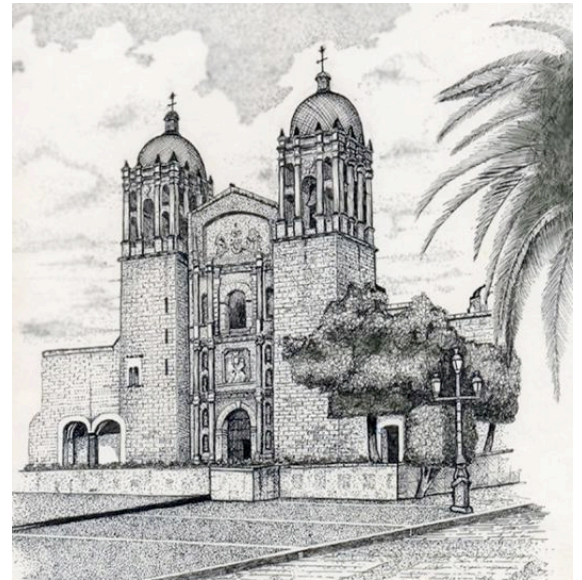
Speaker: **Lorenzo Cuesta**

If you have any ancestor crossing any U.S. border, this presentation may hold the key to finding much valuable information.

Lorenzo Cuesta has been researching his genealogy since the mid 1960s. It all started because his mom "refused to tell him about her in-laws." It was helped by the fact that his father was full of family stories that sounded manicured and polished.

Lorenzo has made repeated trips to small towns in Mexico to visit the churches where his grandparents, great-grandparents, and other family members were baptized, married, and mourned. His research has been blocked, as yours may have been, by relatives, misguided county clerks, and others, but he has found ways around such roadblocks.

This presentation will show you how you can obtain the same type of valuable secondary and collaborative information that Lorenzo Cuesta has found so helpful in his successful research.
