Dealing with the Most Common Research Problems

What if you find three documents that show three different birthdates for your grandfather? How do you know which to believe? Do you even have the right name for your ancestor? Family history researchers often suffer the frustration of conflicting “facts”. Certified genealogist Jim Baker will discuss the best methods of dealing with three common genealogy problems: (1) getting the correct names for your people; (2) getting the right birth/marriage/death data, and (3) working with conflicting evidence.
