FamilySearch is the largest genealogy organization in the world and is operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The FamilySearch mission is to help people connect with their ancestors through easy access to worldwide historical records. The online database is free and the resources are growing by leaps and bounds.
