Security

DGC does not collect sensitive information like U.S. Social Security numbers or birth dates. We take precautions to protect your personal information that we do collect (i.e., contact details like address, phone, email). When you submit such information, it is protected both online and offline. It is encrypted and transmitted to us in a secure way. When submitting online, you can verify this by looking for a lock icon in the address bar or for "https" at the beginning of the address of the web page. While we use encryption to protect personal information transmitted online, we also protect your information offline. Only volunteers

who need the information to perform a specific job are granted access to all of your personally identifiable information. The computer servers on which we store personally identifiable information are kept in a secure environment by our vendor Omsoft.
